Directions and Parking

By Car

From north and south of Boston

Take I-93 North or South to exit 20 for I-90 West (Massachusetts Turnpike). Take I-90 West to exit 20 for Allston and Cambridge. Bear right toward Cambridge. Continue through the first set of lights and get in the left lane. Turn left onto Soldiers Field Road just past the second set of lights and before the bridge. Turn left onto Western Avenue at the first stoplight. Enter the campus through the Batten Way entrance on the right.

From I-90 (Massachusetts Turnpike) Allston/Cambridge Exit

Take the Allston and Cambridge exit. Bear right toward Cambridge. Continue through the first set of lights and get in the left lane. Turn left onto Soldiers Field Road just past the second set of lights and before the bridge. Turn left onto Western Avenue at the first stoplight. Enter the campus through the Batten Way

Parking

Enter main HBS lot through the South Entrance. Inform the parking attendant you are on campus for the "Campus Sustainability at Harvard" event in Spangler Center Auditorium. You will be directed to park in the Soldiers Field Park Garage. There is no charge for parking.

Public transportation

By train

Take the <u>MBTA</u> Red Line (Alewife train) to Harvard Square. Walk south down John F. Kennedy Street, crossing over the Charles River on the Anderson Bridge. Harvard Business School is on the left after the bridge. Take the first entrance into the campus.

By bus

Take #66 bus that runs down JFK Street and North Harvard Street. Exit the bus at the first stop after the bridge. HBS is on the left. Take the first entrance into the campus.
