

Enjoy a walk through woodlands and meadow, an astronomy talk and a planetarium program. A great 2 hrs. for adults and children over 12; bring a red filtered flashlight or headlamp. Joshua's Trust. Meet at Hubbard Sanctuary on Rte. 198, 2.2 mi. north of jct. with Rte. 6 (or take Rte. 44 to Rte. 198.) Park at Town Office. #2

### SATURDAY, OCTOBER 11

# 8:00<sup>AM</sup> Stillness of the River Trail - Eastford, CT (Also at 10 AM and noon today and at 8,10 and noon. Oct. 18)

Adults and children can take an easy, 1-hr. walk with retired teacher George Askew along a nature trail developed and maintained by students as part of their classroom experiences. The trail along the Still River goes through woodland and past a former mill site. Eastford Elem. School. From jct. with Rte. 44 in Eastford, take Rte. 198 north 2 mi. to stop sign at 5-way intersection in Eastford. At Bowen's Garage (Ford), take left on Westford Rd. 1/4 mi. to school on right. Park in lot. ® #3

#### 9.00AM From Rails to Trails - Lebanon, CT

Follow the Airline Trail and observe the stages of work in progress on this slow, 3-hr. walk. Lebanon Rails to Trails Comm. Meet at Airline Trail crossing at Rte. 207 in Amston (Hebron) near the Lebanon town line.

#### 9:00AM Blue Blazes in Yale Forest - Eastford, CT

This a challenging 4-hr. hike for adults with lots of climbs in Yale Forest, requires hiking boots, water, a snack and lunch. East-of-the-River, CT Chapter, AMC. Meet on left side of parking lot of Travelers Restaurant/truck stop, Exit 71 (Ruby Rd.) off I-84. Group will then drive to trailhead, so be prompt. #5

### 9:00AM Rocks, Ghosts and Posts - Norwich, CT

Climb the trail to Meetinghouse Rocks, then visit the Post-Gager Burying Ground to learn about early Norwich and a local ghost named Jock on this 1-hr. moderate walk to some of the city's special places. City of Norwich. From I-395 south, take Exit 82; turn left onto West Town St. (from north, turn right) for 0.7 mi. to stop sign across from Norwichtown Green. Meet at First Congregational Church. #6

# 9:00AM From Forest to Flooring - Pomfret, CT (Also at 10 and 11 AM today)

Take an easy 1-hr. tour of a modern sawmill and lumber manufacturing facility and learn how trees become flooring, post and beam framing, and landscaping mulch. Hull Forest Products. From jct. with Rte. 44 in Abington, follow Rte. 97 north 1.2 mi. #7

### 9:30AM Nature's Way - Coventry, CT

Naturalist Chuck Conkling leads this slow, 3/4-mi., 1-hr. walk for adults and children over 5 on trails along the river and through the woods of Creaser Park. Learn to identify trees and various habitats and hear about current park projects. Town of Coventry. From jct. with Rte. 44 at Brookside Plaza, take Rte. 31 south. Take first right to stop sign, then turn left. Entrance is on right; park in lot by Bldg. 4. ® #8

# 9:30AM 50 Foot to the Hollow - Mansfield, CT

After carpooling to the trailhead, hikers will set off along the Nipmuc Trail to discover woodlands, mill ruins, an esker, and great foliage views on this 4 1/2-hr. trek for adults and older children. Bring water and a lunch. AMC & Friends of Mansfield Hollow. From I-84, take Rte. 195 south through Storrs; go left at first stoplight south of jct. with Rte. 89 onto Basset Bridge Rd. for 1 mi. to Mansfield Hollow State Park. ® #9

#### 9.30AM A River Threads Through It - Windham, CT

Discover the Willimantic River and the industrial mill site of the former Willimantic Thread/American Thread Co. as you pass the mill buildings and homes of workers and managers on this 1 1/2-hr. stroll featuring views painted by 19th century impressionist J. Alden Weir. Windham Textile & History Museum. Rte. 66 (Main St., Willimantic), 2 blocks east of the Frog Bridge; park at the museum or across the street at Heritage State Park.

### 10:00<sup>AM</sup> Alien Invasion at Capen Hill - Charlton, MA (Also at 10 AM, Sat., Oct. 18)

Naturalist Jerry Suprenant leads a 2-mi., 1 1/2-hr. walk that examines the past, present and future of invasive plant species that are taking over our fields and trails. Capen Hill Nature Sanctuary. Take Rte. 20 west from jct. with Rte. 169. Turn left onto Capen Rd. and follow to Visitor's Center at end. ® #11

# 10:00<sup>AM</sup> And They Swam, And They Swam ...-

Pass a working hydroelectric station to the 1882 Greeneville Dam and 1996 fishlift on this slow 1-hr. walk with the senior watch engineer. Norwich Public Utilities. From I-395, take Exit 81 to Rte. 2 east to Rte. 12 north. Go through traffic light at Rte. 2 turn-off; turn right at next light to 8th St., then left into first drive on left. Park behind brick bldg. #12

#### 10.00AM "C" is for Critter - Brooklyn, CT

Take a 1-hr. easy walk based on four educational themes: birds, pond, rotten logs and trees. Each station features fun facts and activities for the whole family. Brooklyn Conservation Commiss. From Rte. 169, take Rte. 6 east to the blinking yellow light. Turn right onto Prince Hill Rd. to Gorman Rd. Go straight on Gorman 1/5 mi. Park behind Brooklyn Elem. School on right. © #13

### 10:00AM Colonial Time Travel - Preston, CT

Learn about the Long Society Meetinghouse, then stroll through the graveyard that surrounds it on a 1 1/2-hr. excursion to the past. The colonial tombstones tell a great deal about the people who carved them and those whom they commemorate. Preston Historical Soc. From Rte. 165 in Preston, 1 mi. from the Norwich town line, turn onto Long Society Rd.; meetinghouse is 1/4 mi. ahead. #14

# 10:00AM From Forest to Flooring - Pomfret, CT (See 9 AM today)

# 10:00AM Legend of Diana's Pool - Chaplin, CT

Explore this beautiful spot and hear about the legend, the history of Chaplin, the remains of a dam that once powered machinery used to make wood and paper products, and the Natchaug River, a challenge for kayakers. Adults and children will enjoy this 1/2-mi., 1 hr. walk, but need proper footwear, since the rocks can be slippery. Friends of Mansfield Hollow, Inc. Park at Chaplin Firehouse on Rte. 198, just north of Rte. 6 jct. Meet at Diana's Pool Rd., 100 yds. north of firehouse. #15

#### 10:00AM Treasures on the Trails - Mansfield, CT

Get an introduction to the popular activity called "letterboxing," then follow the clues on this easy 2-hr. walk to find what treasures await. Joshua's Trust. Take Rte. 195 (Storrs Rd.) to Rte. 89 to Bradley-Buchanen Woods in Mansfield Ctr. ® #16

10:00 AM Mill Village Memories - Thompson, CT Visit a mill village as it was in the early 1940s and '50s and see how families then worked and played on this easy 2 hr. stroll. Learn how the water, the railroad and the workers produced some of the finest cotton cloth in the U. S. Thompson Historical Soc. Meet at Lions Bandstand directly off Riverside Dr. (Rte. 12) across from Town Hall. (§) #17

10:00<sup>AM</sup> Stillness of the River Trail - Eastford, CT (See 8 AM today)

10:00<sup>AM</sup> Strolling Sturbridge Common - Sturbridge, MA

See the Common and the structures around it, both inside and out, including Town Hall, the Joshua Hyde Library, Center School, the Old Burying Ground, and the bandstand, on this 1 1/2 hr. stroll. Sturbridge Historical Soc. From Rte. 20, take Rte. 131 east 1/2 mi. to Town Hall parking lot. ® & #18

11:00<sup>AM</sup> From Forest to Flooring - Pomfret, CT (See 9 AM today)

11:00<sup>AM</sup> West Side Stories - Norwich, CT (Also at 11 AM, Mon., Oct. 13)

Take a 1-hr. stroll around a little-known Victorian neighborhood on the city's West Side with Municipal Historian Dale Plummer and view some beautiful examples of Italianate, Greek Revival, Queen Anne and Gothic Revival architecture. City of Norwich. From I-395 south, take Exit 80; turn left (from I-395 north, turn right) onto Rte. 82 and follow it for 2 mi. through 11 lights. Go left onto Fairmount St. just past First Baptist Church. Park on Fairmount and meet at the church. #19

Noon Stillness of the River Trail - Eastford, CT

1:00PM Spirits & the Smuggler's Tree - Ashford, CT Adults and children over 5 can take this 1-hr walk on

a mowed woods trail around a private pond to the site of Smuggler's Tree, a legendary spot for procuring spirits in the 1800s. Optional open house and distillery tours 10 AM-4 PM. Westford Distillers. From Rte. 44 jct., go north on Rte. 89 for 2 mi. Turn left on Westford Hill Rd. for 2 mi. to Congregational Church. Bear left onto Chatey Rd. 1 mi. to first house on right. Park at field entrance. ® #20

1:00PM Barns, Bears and Bomb Shelters at Capen Hill- Charlton, MA

(Also at 1 PM, Oct. 18)

Start your tour in the Visitor's Ctr., once the Wells' home, then meet the Sanctuary's animal residents and learn about the site's connections with Grizzly Adams and the Cold War. Capen Hill Nature Sanctuary. Take Rte. 20 west from jct. with Rte. 169. Turn left on Capen Rd. and follow to Visitor's Center at end. ® #21

1:00PM The Hidden Natchaug - Chaplin, CT

Adults and children over 4 can walk the tranquil banks of lovely Stonehouse Brook on this 2-mi., 2-hr. stroll, entering a forgotten forest and pastoral landscape, then linger along a primeval stretch of the river to learn basic naturalist and orienteering skills. (Wear boots!) Naubesatuck Watershed Council. From Rte. 6 in Chaplin, take Rte. 198 north, then first left onto Bedlam Rd., just after Natchaug River Bridge; park near Bedlam Cemetery. #22

1:00<sup>PM</sup> Creating a Backyard Wildlife Garden - Hampton, CT

(Also at 1 PM, Oct. 18)

Visit our butterfly and wildlife gardens, then plan the blueprints for your own back yard on this easy 2-hr. walk. Goodwin Nature Ctr. From Rte. 6 in Hampton, go 3 mi. east of Rte. 198 or 1 1/2 mi. west of Rte. 97. Park in marked areas. **®** #23

1:00PM From Coney Rock You Can See Forever - Mansfield, CT

This 2-hr. moderate, sometimes steep, walk passes through the Coney Rock Preserve amid stands of mixed hardwood and hemlocks, some recently logged areas, past a granite cliff with a spectacular vista. Mansfield Parks Advisory Comm./Joshua's Trust. From jct. with Rte. 89, take Rte. 195 north for 0.2 mi.; turn right at blinker onto Chaffeeville Rd. for 1.7 mi. At Boussa Rd., turn into large gravel lot on right. #24

2:00PM Moos and More - Franklin, CT (Also at 2 PM on Oct. 12, 18, and 19)

Visit the cows during milking and walk through the barn, then hike through fields and woods for a beautiful view of the autumn hillsides and, weather permitting, the corn harvest, on this 1 1/2-hr. family walk. Cushman Farms. On Rte. 87 (Lebanon Rd.), farm is 3 mi. south of jct. with Rte. 207 and 3 mi. north of jct. with Rte. 32. ® #25

2:00PM The Civil War: A Local Perspective - Putnam, CT (Also at 2 PM, Oct. 18 and 19)

Take a stroll and learn about the Putnam residents who served, including naval hero Tommy Taylor, last survivor of the battle between the Monitor and the Merrimac. Aspinock Historical Soc. Take Exit 96 off I-395; follow Rte. 12 (Grove St.) to Ring St. Park onstreet near monument. & #26

2:00PM Thamesville - Norwich, CT
(Also at 2 PM on Oct. 13)

Enjoy the beautiful homes in the Craftsman and other 20th-century styles on this 1-hr. easy walk. Once a streetcar suburb of Norwich, Thamesville was also the site of a shipyard, ironworks and woolen mill. City of Norwich. From I-395 south, take Exit 80; turn left at end of ramp (from north, turn right). Follow Rte. 82 for 1 mi.; turn right on Dunham to end, then left at light onto W. Thames for 1/4 mi. Turn left onto Brown Rd. and park. #27



2:00<sup>PM</sup> Teale's Trail Wood - Hampton, CT (Also at 4 PM, Oct. 12)

Adults and children over 10 can see Trail Wood through the eyes and words of naturalist Edwin Way Teale on this 2 hr., 2-mi. hike. CT Audubon Soc. From Rte. 44 in Hampton, go south on Rte. 97 for 5 mi. Turn right on Kenyon Rd. for 1/2 mi., then left into Trail Wood. Park in lot. ® #28

2:00PM Beating the Bounds - Scotland, CT

Investigate the evolution of the 18th-century farm-scape, the original laneways, reconstructed bridge and wild areas at the birthplace of Gov. Samuel Huntington. Gov. Samuel Huntington Trust. From Canterbury, take Rte. 14 just past Rte. 97 jct. in center of Scotland. ® #29

2:00PM Nature's Splendor - Preston, CT

Take a walk of discovery along well-established trails around small ponds and through former pastures, mowed hay fields and woods on this easy 2-hr. ramble. Avalonia Land Conservancy. From Rte. 2, go north on Rte. 164. A few hundred feet after crossing Rte.165 and passing fire dept., turn left on Krug Rd. Park 1/2 mi. ahead in left field.

7:00PM A Sense of the Night - Pomfret, CT

Discover Bafflin Sanctuary under cover of darkness through the sounds and scents of forests and meadows in autumn on this 2-hr. hilly walk for adults and older children. (Wear waterproof boots.) From Rte. 101, travel 1 mi. north on Rte. 169 (Pomfret St.) to CT Audubon Nature Ctr. ® #31

#### SUNDAY, OCTOBER 12

7:00AM Birds of Morning - Pomfret, CT

Travel the quiet roads, meadows, hills and woodlands of Bafflin Sanctuary with a CAS land manager in search of a wide variety of birds on this moderate 2-hr. walk. From Rte. 101, travel 1 mi. north on Rte. 169 (Pomfret St.); take first right onto Day Rd. Park beside 1895 barn. ® #32

9.00AM Triphammer Brook Trail - Oxford, MA

Join a ranger on a 3-hr. walk from Clara Barton's grave, past vernal pools, beaver dams, wetlands, and a historic mill dam. U. S. Army Corps. From I-395, take Exit 4 B to Oxford Ctr.; turn right (north) at the light, onto Main St. for 2 mi. to North Cemetery. Park on left. #33

9.30AM Rad's Forest Fun - Hampton, CT

Take an educational and entertaining 2-hr. walk through the Rad Ostby Memorial Forest, part of the Wolf Den Land Trust, with a variety of experts on forest management, archaeology and diverse flora. Then sing some traditional American folk songs accompanied (weather permitting) by budding instrumentalists. Bring your instrument, but no pianos, please! ECFLA/Wolf Den Land Trust. From Rte. 6 in Hampton, take Old Rte. 6 east 1/2 mi. to Rad's Forest sign on north side of the road. #34

# 10:00<sup>AM</sup> Exploring the Quinebaug Highlands - Ashford, CT

Project Director Bill Toomey leads this 4-mi., 2-hr. adult hike through the one of the largest remaining blocks of contiguous forest in Southern New England. Learn about protecting the forests and experience a great view! The Nature Conservancy. From Rte. 44 in Ashford, take Rte. 89 north. In Westford, go right onto Boston Hollow Rd. for several miles. Park at Blue Trail signs along the road. #35

10:00 AM Strolling Northside Village - Charlton, MA

Enjoy this architectural, historical and horticultural tour through Charlton's scenic Northside Historic District. Stroll through Fay Mountain Farm up to the militia lot and pass the Rider Tavern on this easy 1-mi., 3/4-hr. family walk. Charlton Heritage Preservation Trust. Follow Rte. 169 N to end; merge right onto Rte. 20 east; turn left on Northside Rd., left on Stafford St., then immediately right on Cemetery Rd. (Or: Take Mass. Pike to Rte. 20 onto Northside Rd.; then follow previous directions.) Park on right. #36

10:00AM Where the Buffalo Roam - Brooklyn, CT (Also at 10 AM, Oct. 13 and 19)

Children and adults should wear sturdy, casual shoes to enjoy this slow, hilly 1/2-mi., 1-hr. walk through fields and along a dirt road to see the bison and handling facility. Creamery Brook Bison. Take Rte. 6 in Brooklyn to Allen Hill Rd.; go 2 mi., then turn right on Creamery Brook Rd. for 1/2 mi.; turn left on Purvis Rd. to farm. ® #37

10:00AM Midstate Trail Sampler - Charlton, MA

Adults and children over 8 can see the "cow tunnel" and cross a wall using a stile on this 2 1/2-mi., 1 1/2-mi. moderate walk over country roads and cart paths. Go west 3 mi. on Rte. 20 from jct. with Rte. 56. Take left on Worcester Rd., then left to trail crossing (marked with yellow triangles). #38

10:00<sup>AM</sup> View From Carpenters Rocks - Sturbridge, MA

Walk along a woodland trail and observe the flora and fauna on the way to Carpenters Rocks with a panoramic view of Walker Pond and beyond. Opacum Land Trust. From I-84 and Mass. Pike, go east on Rte. 20 for 1 1/2 mi., then left on Rte. 49. Follow signs to Wells State Park. ® #39

11:00<sup>AM</sup> The Railroad Era - Willimantic, CT

Demonstrations and equipment displays along with a walk near the river and the old New Haven Rail yard will highlight this easy 1-hr. stroll. Optional tour of the museum follows. CT Eastern Railroad Museum. Head south very briefly on Rte. 32 (Bridge St.) at the Chamber of Commerce in Willimantic and cross R. R. tracks; park at museum on right. (8) #40

11:00AM A New Village Gem - Coventry, CT

Take an easy, 1-hr. tour of Coutou Park and learn about this new and developing part of Coventry Village. This property is an inspiration for those interested in preserving land. (Wear boots!) Town of Coventry. Park at the ruins of Shoddy Mill across from Bidwell Tavern on Rte. 31 near jct. of Rtes. 31 and 275. #41

11:00AM Historical Woodland Walk - Woodstock, CT

Enjoy woods, wildlife, and an unusual tale of the ruins of an early community on this slow 2 1/2-hr. walk for adults and children over 10 with parents. Optional tour of Solair, one of America's oldest nudist camps, follows. Bring lunch, water; full clothing required. Solair Recreation League. From Rte. 197 jct., take Rte. 169 north 0.1 mi.; turn left onto English Neighborhood Rd. for 3.5 mi. to end at stop sign. Go straight on dirt road and down hill to camp entrance.

Noon The "Dam" Walk - Windham, CT

(If pouring, walk is postponed until noon, Oct. 13) Learn about the history of Mansfield Hollow Dam and Windham Airport on this easy 1-hr. walk along the causeway. Suitable for all ages, but caution is required because the causeway is bordered by steep drop-offs. Friends of Mansfield Hollow. Meet and park at the commuter lot off Rte. 6, just south of Rte. 203. © #43

Noon Changing Times on Main St. - Putnam, CT Revisit the 1955 Flood that ravaged Main St., then go

Revisit the 1955 Flood that ravaged Main St., then g forward in time to the thriving commercial and antique district of today. Finish this easy 1-hr. walk with a look at the Gertrude Warner Museum, set in a boxcar, like the author's famous Boxcar Children series. Aspinock Historical Soc. From I-395, take Exit 97 west onto Rte. 44 to Kennedy Dr. along river in downtown Putnam. Park in Riverfront Commons lot. ® & \$\\$#44\$

# Noon Privy to Strong, Porter, Wright & Hale - Coventry, CT

Take a casual 1-hr. walk around the Strong Porter Farm, once thought to be the childhood home of Nathan Hale's mother, Elizabeth Strong, then see the site of the home of Asher Wright, Hale's friend, a recently reclaimed barn foundation, a restored privy, and the neighboring Dexter Farm. Optional tours of Strong Porter Museum. Coventry Historical Soc. Follow signs from Rtes. 44, 31 or 6 to Nathan Hale Homestead, then continue west to 2382 South St. Park at Strong-Porter museum. & \$\\$#45\$

1:00PM Stone by Stone - Coventry, CT

Join UConn professor and author Robert M. Thorson as he examines the stone walls at the Hale Homestead for unique clues to each one's past and highlights key issues from his best-selling book, Stone by Stone: The Magnificent History of New England's Stone Walls. A book-signing, pie sale and optional house tour follow. Antiquarian & Landmarks Soc. Follow signs from Rtes. 44, 31 or 6 to Nathan Hale Homestead, 2299 South St.; park on site. ® #46

1:00PM Romp in the Swamp - Mansfield, CT

Wear waterproof shoes to examine aquatic life in Schoolhouse Brook and Bicentennial Pond with the Education Director of the Lutz Children's Museum. This 2-hr. easy walk is great for children age 3 and older. Town of Mansfield. From Rte. 195, turn onto Clover Mill Rd. to Schoolhouse Brook parking area. © #47

1.00PM A Trip Around the Hill - Dudley, MA

Learn the history of the Dudley Hill Common and the buildings around it, including some excellent examples of Federal and Greek Revival architecture. Finish this easy 2-hr. walk with a look inside the historic Black Tavern. Dudley Historical Comm. From Rte. 197 in Dudley, follow signs to Nichols College to Town Common on Center Rd. 
