






The Cree Nation occupies a vast area of the James Bay region of Canada.































### **Background**

- Announcement of the project in 1972
- Divide and conquer
- Boundaries extension act of 1912
- 1973 court case won (balance of convenience)
- 1975 Land Claim Settlement
- Community legal strategy
- 1978 relocating
- The Engineering of consent
- 2002 referendum
- Not just hydro, but minerals, water, forestry
- Coming off the land and onto the wage economy (faster than other communities)
- Population growth



### **Current situation**


- Issues of this size in general massive changes in geography
- Impacts on local people
- We buy the hydro here, but it affects other people elsewhere
- Hydro power is not "green" power
